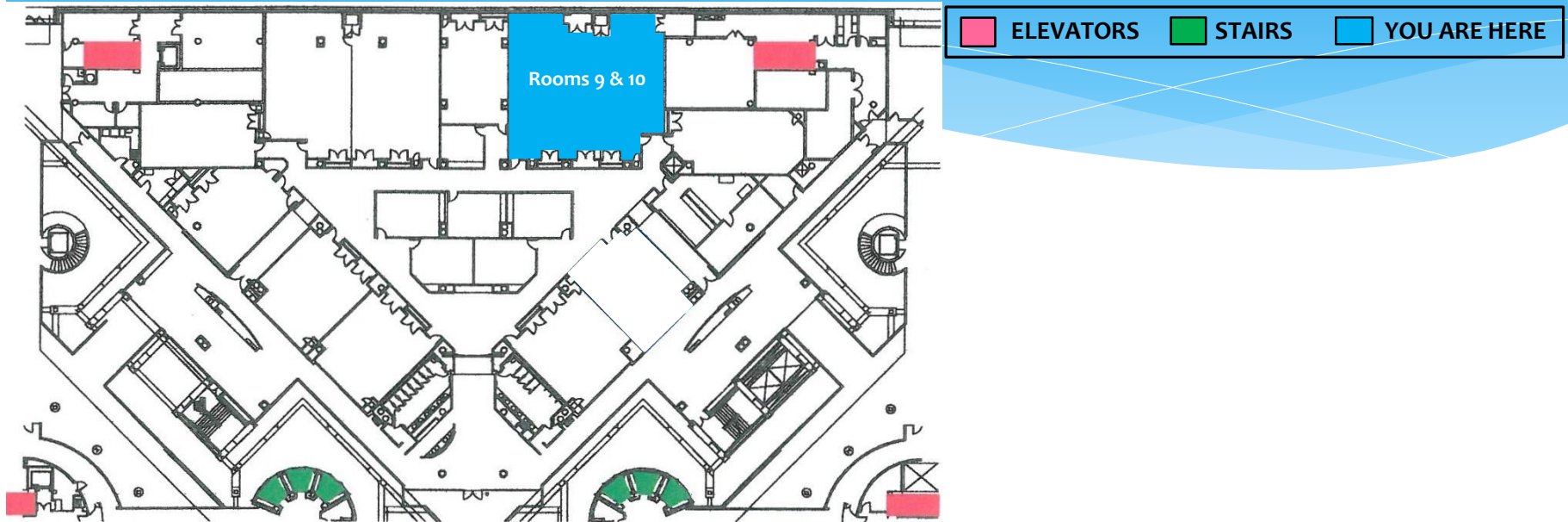


Emergency Procedures

GM Learning Center, Level 2—Training Rooms 9/10



SAFETY PROTOCOL

In case of fire on this floor:

1. Activate the Building Alarm System. If time permits, contact Security at 7-1111 to give location and nature of fire.
2. Exit area by nearest exit.

If the Building evacuation alarm is activated:

1. Proceed to the inner core area.
2. Wait for evacuation instructions over the building public address system.

Emergency Station (Tornado)

1. Proceed to the inner core area - remain until all clear is announced.

Pick up designated emergency phone in elevator lobby or inner core hallway.

Note: The inner core (center core) is the stairwell in the center and the area in the hallway near the stairs on both sides.

Follow the exit signs to your closest exit.

Minimal opportunity to encourage and enjoy the wildlife and Riverfront. The entire site is 40 acres, with only 3 acres available for flora and fauna.

Direct access is now available to the Riverfront promenade, which consists of a grove of trees and a walkway connecting the garden rooms filled with flowers, bushes and trees. An urban garden was added in Spring 2014, and the size tripled in 2015. In 2017, the garden will expand again to include a ‘living wall’ that will feed the Monarch butterflies and grow wildflowers for our resident honey bees.

Connecting to our Environment

- ❖ Working jointly with the Riverfront Conservancy to enhance the property along the Detroit River.
- ❖ Plant donations of native Michigan plants from GM Tech Center and GMRENCEN site employees.
- ❖ Memorial tree donations.
- ❖ Ongoing development of the Butterfly Garden. In 2016, expanded plant bed space with Michigan native plants and additional Milkweed, as well as held an educational Monarch butterfly release on the Rooftop Garden.
- ❖ Earth Day seedling give away.



Connecting to our Environment

(Continued)

- ❖ Monthly 'Lunch & Learn' educational speakers include the Cranbrook Institute Organization for Bat Conservation, a certified arborist (WH Cannon), MDNR Explorers Program and the Detroit Historical Society.
- ❖ Added two honey bee hives to the rooftop garden in Spring 2015 and a third honey bee hive in 2016.
- ❖ Installed a bat box in Fall 2016.
